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On 12 August 2026 police responded to the 8600 block of 103rd Street in reference to a Theft. The complainant explained that they parked their bike at the library and entered. Upon exiting, their bicycle was missing. The incident is under investigation.

On 12 August 2026 police responded to the 11300 block of Moraine Drive in reference to a Deceptive Practices. The complainant explained that there was approximately \$3000.00 in fraudulent charges on their credit card. The incident is under investigation.

On 12 August 2026 police responded to the 10400 block of 73rd Court in reference to a Deceptive Practices. The complainant explained that they worked for Uber and received a phone call from a subject they believed worked for Uber. The complainant was advised to provide their driver's license and credit card information to the caller. Upon doing so, the complainant started receiving notifications, from their bank, regarding attempted withdrawals of large sums of money. The incident is under investigation.

On 12 August 2026 police responded to 8400 block of Sun Valley Drive in reference to a Burglary from Motor Vehicle. The complainant explained that unknown subject(s) entered their parked and unlocked vehicle. A wallet with pictures and an expired credit card were taken. The incident is under investigation.

On 13 August 2026 police responded to the 10600 block of 80th Court in reference to a Theft of Labor. The complainant explained that they provided transportation services for a subject. Upon arrival at their requested location, the subject refused to pay, exited the cab, and entered a residence. The incident is under investigation.
