On 21 July 2026 police were called to the 10300 block of Interlochen Drive to investigate the report of a suspicious person. A phone call was made claiming that someone was shot at that location. Upon further investigation, there was no shooting and the call was deemed to be fictitious.

On 22 July 2026 police were called to the 10300 block of Roberts Road to investigate the report of disorderly conduct. An unknown subject called and stated they would bomb the building. The scene was secured and there was no credible information that a bombing would take place.

On 22 July 2026 police were called to the 8500 block of 103rd Street to investigate the report of theft. The complainant reported their bicycle being stolen after being parked outside.

On 23 July 2026 police were called to the 8000 block of 111th Street to investigate the report of theft from motor vehicle. The vehicle was parked with the windows open and unknown person(s) took a phone from the car.

On 24 July 2026 police arrested Mbagnick M. Thiam, age 25 of Chicago for possession of cannabis. The arrest stems from a traffic stop in the 7600 block of 103rd Street.

On 22 July 2026 police were called to the 10100 block of 84th Terrace to investigate the report of harassment by telephone. The complainant stated they were receiving harassing text messages from a known acquaintance. They also stated they did not want to sign complaints.
