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NEWS RELEASE

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On 18 August 2026 police responded to the 10300 block of 81st Court in reference to a Theft. The complainant explained that they observed a male subject put something in their mailbox while taking the complainant's outgoing mail. The outgoing mail contained checks for utility bills. The complainant was advised to cancel their checks and change their bank account numbers. The incident is under investigation.

On 20 August 2026 Angel A. Perdomo, age 18 of Blue Island, turned himself in on a warrant for Aggravated Assault. The arrest stemmed from an incident that occurred on 27 April 2026 in the 11000 block of Southwest Highway.

On 21 August 2026 police responded to the 11000 block of Roberts Road in reference to a Traffic Crash. Police arrested Jaiton M. Mangun, age 32 of Burnham, for Driving while Driver's License Suspended and other traffic offenses.

On 21 August 2026 police arrested Darryl G. Ledbetter, age 64 of Justice, for Driving Under the Influence and other traffic offenses. The arrest stemmed from a traffic stop in the 9000 block of 111th Street.

On 23 August 2026 police arrested Dawid A. Jaskiewicz, age 41 Oak Lawn, for Driving Under the Influence and other traffic offenses. The arrest stemmed from a traffic stop in the 8600 block of 103rd Street.

On 24 August 2026 police responded to 7634 W. 111th Street, Stella's Gaming Café, in reference to a Burglar Alarm. When officers arrived, they observed 4 subjects dressed in all black with hoodies and masks immediately entering a white Audi SUV and fleeing westbound on 111th Street. The front door glass

to the Café was shattered. Inside the Café, six gaming machines were damaged, and 2 cash boxes were missing. The incident is under investigation.
